Engage	Our topic will begin with a "Visiting America" launch day in our classrooms, where we will be finding out some key facts about its location, features and the history of the USA. The children will also get the chance to learn about the different states. We will travel to a number of destinations and enjoy experiences such as Texas line dancing, New York cityscape art and magnificent views on	Talk to your child about anything American that you come across day to day. Develop	We will then venture further afield in America, finding out about the landscape and important landmarks such as the Grand Canyon and the Everglades. As we travel, we will find out about the way of life for the Native American Iroquois people, both in the past and nowadays. Innovate	We will read lots of stories about how different animals got their features and then we will show off our creative writing skills by planning and writing our own!	They should know all times tables up to x12 by the end of year 4!
		Spellings will be given out every week, to be tested on a Monday morning. Please encourage your child to practise these and fill in the sheet, writing interesting sentences to describe the words.
Express	Can we plan a trip! We will use the internet to find out how much flights from London Gatwick to JFK airport in New York will cost, and consider how much holidays will cost. We won't forget to book flights, accommodation, food and entertainment.	Regular reading (both quietly and to an adult) is still very important, as is a book at bedtime! Don't forget to write in the reading diary. (At least 3 times a week)

Maths	After finishing our unit on fractions, children will continue to explore mass in kilograms and grams, before moving on to capacity.		
English	We will read a range of traditional Native American Myths and Legends and will use ideas from them to have fun writing our own myth at the end of the term. They will explore how animals got their special adaptive features, whilst perfecting their story writing skills.		
Science	We will have fun predicting and testing if circuits will work and will learn the names of lots of scientific circuit components. We will have fun creating a light up sign towards the end of the unit, and we will investigate what makes the best conductor. Plus, we have a special Science whole school investigation for British Science Week.		
Art & Design	We will be creating various weavings using different materials. We will also be looking at the artist Sharon Cummings and creating artwork using her style. These are examples of her unique artwork.	Music	Our unit this term focuses on Jazz music. We will be learning about ragtime style music, Dixieland music and scat singing. We will then create a jazz motif using a swung rhythm and play a jazz version of a nursery rhyme using tuned percussion.
ting	We will be exploring media trailers and then using our new skills to have a go at our own. We will be adding pictures, sounds and text.	RE	This Christianity unit will teach the key aspects of the Easter story and will focus on the question 'What is good about Good Friday?'
Computing		PSHE	Our PSHE focus this term is Money Matters. We will be thinking about job roles and why people go to work. We will talk about the importance of managing money and think about wants and needs.
History	We will use a range of source materials to find out about America, the Native American Iroquois tribe, its traditions and history.
